QUESTIONS

- Initially, how did Jake feel? How did he express his emotions?
- To prevent the situation from deteriorating, what could the following people have done?
- Jake? Their friends?
- Vanessa? Bill?
- What consequences do you think the post will have for Vanessa? And for Jake?
- Given that Jake's original message was inappropriate, how could he have expressed himself more respectfully?
- What do you think happened next?

JAKE

So you're going out with Bill now? Way to go! Now everyone knows what a real #*@!!*# you are. We were together for two months and broke up barely two weeks ago . . . and you're already seeing someone else? Well, I couldn't care less. Your boyfriend looks like a real **fag**, besides which he's just a **nerd** from 5th grade. Long live your loser relationship!!!

VANESSA

Hey, what's your problem? It's over between you and me, and I can do whatever I want with my life. Quit being stupid and move on. I love my boyfriend, he's a million times better than you.

LOVE IS BLIND, BUT OTHER PEOPLE AREN'T!

CONTEXT

Jake withdraws from the conversation. Two hours later, he realizes he may have gone too far, and should never have written what he did as a public comment. He gets scared. When he logs back onto the social network, he sees other people's comments. There are more and more threats.

Jake also reads a private message from Bill. It contains a threat, and Jake becomes even more frightened.

Jake wonders what he can do to reduce the damage; he's terrified.

QUESTIONS

- What solutions would you suggest to Jake?

- Now, in the classroom or using the "Be cyber cool" platform, write a message that you believe <u>might have a</u> <u>positive impact</u> on the conversation. Share your answers with other students at the school.



Under the *Criminal Code*, making threats is illegal. Did you know that "joking" isn't an acceptable defence in criminal law? Even if a person is only joking (in other words, if the threat is made for fun), the *Criminal Code* still applies, if it covers the situation. So if you feel threatened and are worried about your safety, even online, you can contact the authorities and ask them to check out the threat.
