




Intentions of the meeting

Learning through play


Children have different strategies they can apply in order to learn, including imitating, observing, experimenting and questioning. However, play is the ideal way for children to learn and develop their full potential.




Classroom organization

The classroom must be physically adapted to the needs of 4- to 6-year-old children and be both safe and easily accessible. It should be organized in such a way as to foster the children's participation and encourage them to explore different types of play (e.g., games that involve motor skills, manipulation of objects; symbolic play; construction games; board games).



Reflecting on my environment



• For certain children, what can I plan in advance in order to meet their needs?

 Other than the classroom, what areas in the school can be conducive to children's learning?









- With regard to the layout of my classroom:
 - What do I usually find in my environment at the beginning of the year?
 - What is changeable in my classroom environment?
 - What evolves over the course of the year?
 - What motivates me to make changes?
 - Are there any essential elements that remain the same throughout the year?
 - What has changed or improved since the implementation of the new Program?
 - Do children have a say in the organization and layout of the classroom space?

- Regarding the materials:
 - How do the proposed materials meet the needs, respective interests and potential of the children?
 - How do the materials used challenge the children in ways that are appropriate for them (zone of proximal development)?
 - How are the materials proposed to the children varied and evolving (limited paper/pencil, usage, more handling)?

- Regarding the materials:
 - What are the observable manifestations in the children that indicate to me that the materials are adequate or inadequate?
 - How do the materials support discovery and invention activities?
 - Are the materials that I have put in place safe for the children?


- With regard to the developing child:
 - What piques the curiosity of the children in my classroom?
 - In what contexts can I observe their needs, their potential and their interests?
 - How do I incorporate the children's suggestions and ideas into my classroom?
 - What do I put in place to take into consideration the interests and needs of the children?
 - What other spaces in the school (art room, computer lab, gymnasium, school yard, park, the agora when the elementary school children are at recess) allow me to tap into the spontaneity and interests of the children?




Cultivate the pleasure of exploring, discovering and learning





Lay the foundations for future schooling




